



## ALL SAINTS/ALL SOULS WEEKEND

This weekend is a special weekend for the Church. Saturday, November 1st is the *Solemnity of All Saints*. Although not a Day of Obligation this year because it falls on a Saturday, it is still a *Holy Day*. It is a day we pause and remember all those who have joined the Communion of Saints in heaven: those saints whose names we know, and the countless others who we do not know, but their good deeds and virtue stand before us as a witness for our hope to achieve communion with the saints in heaven.

Sunday, November 2nd is the *Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed* or *All Souls Day*. In the history of the Church, it has always been a day of praying for those whom we know and those who we do not know who have passed away and await the *Beatific Vision* or Communion with the Saints. In modern times, it has become a sort of mini Catholic Memorial Day, with the focus on the memory of those who have died within our families and circle of friends whom we remember. Please pray for all the Faithful Departed on this day. Remember especially those who have no one to pray for them, including deceased priests who have served our parishes and the Diocese of Scranton.

#### THE SACRAMENTS

Baptism

Expecting or new parents are asked to contact the Parish Office as soon as possible to make the arrangements and if necessary, attend the Pre-Baptismal Session. The celebration of the Sacrament is usually held after the 11:30 a.m. Mass on Sundays.

#### Confirmation

The Sacrament is celebrated for 8th grade students each spring semester. Students must be consecutively enrolled in our Parish Religious Education Program or in Catholic Schools to be eligible. Students must meet all requirements set by the Diocese of Scranton and the Parish.

#### Matrimony

Couples planning to get married are asked to contact the parish office as soon as possible (no less than 6 months prior) to reserve a date and begin the necessary paper work. The dates at the Church are not guaranteed until an actual meeting with the pastor takes place.
