#### PARISH PROPERTY UPDATE

We received several unsuccessful bids for the properties on Shoemaker Street and Barber Street. The bids were overall too low to be considered. We did have a successful bid on the former caretaker's house on Shoemaker. Later, a family purchased the land on which the former Church building was located for the asking price. It was determined that the former rectory on Shoemaker Street was more valuable than what it was appraised at originally. We have rented that structure to the Sisters, Servants of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, which will house four IHM Sisters. We are awaiting Diocesan approval of the three properties who have buyers. We are still looking to sell the former Convent on Barber Street. We will keep you updated as we go.

#### JUNE 22nd, CORPUS CHRISTI SUNDAY

On Sunday June 22nd, the Universal Church will celebrate Corpus Christi Sunday, the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. You may recall that our first Sunday together as a new parish was back in 2012 on the Solemnity of Corpus Christi. We have then two very important reasons to celebrate on this day. Let's come together for our regular celebrations of the Eucharist this weekend and have a period of Adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament (with perhaps an outdoor procession if weather permits) after the 11:30 a.m. Mass until 5:30 p.m. We will conclude the day with Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament and a Special Mass at 5:30 p.m. All are most welcome to attend some or all of this day of prayer. We will need people to sign-up for the Adoration on Sunday afternoon so that our Sacred Lord is not left alone on the altar. Please see the forms at the entrance of the Church. Let's worship our Eucharistic Savior this day by making it a solemn occasion of adoration and praise. Families are encouraged to bring their children for even a brief period of adoration so that they may be exposed to this awesome tradition of the Church. More to come in the following weeks.
